



Progress is underway on the new Library headed to South Jefferson County!

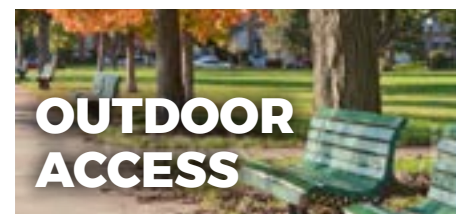
Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL) recently contracted with Eppstein Uhan Architects. We have begun searching for a suitable building to renovate, based on the community input we received at the beginning of 2021. The property to renovate or land to build on will be evaluated based on our facility needs and ambitions for what the space can be.
