Through our Service Point Development & Expansion initiative, we're expanding, redesigning and building new library spaces to provide every Jefferson County resident with convenient access to library resources and support.

SUPPORTING FUTURE GROWTH

Northwest Jeffco is rapidly expanding, with households projected to grow by 36% from 2020 to 2030. In response, JCPL purchased land in July for a destination library to meet both current and future needs of this growing area and provide convenient access to library resources for generations to come. A NEW CHAPTER BEGINS FOR SOUTH JEFFCO

In August, the Board of Trustees made a milestone decision by authorizing a purchase and sale agreement for an existing property in Littleton, bringing us one step closer to improving access to library resources for the entire community. REDESIGNING ARVADA LIBRARY

Arvada population growth continues to outpace the county, driving a 66% increase in library program attendance since 2022. To meet growing demands and address emerging concerns, JCPL embarked on a library redesign. July 2024 community engagement efforts provided feedback to help guide the redesign effort. A NEW SPACE FOR CONIFER LIBRARY

Since 1996, Conifer Library has operated within Conifer High School, limiting public access hours. To better serve this community, JCPL signed a 10-year lease for a new library in downtown Conifer and design is underway.

A NEW HOLDS LOCKER IN WEST LAKEWOOD

JCPL rolled out the Green Mountain Holds Locker in West Lakewood in early 2024, expanding access to library materials at all hours and during Library closures. It quickly became our busiest and most-visited locker, with 8,441 visits and 29,669 items circulated throughout the year! We now provide 24/7 access to holds materials at 11 locations, with plans to install another in early 2025.



FOCUS ON BUILDING LITERACIES

Our Lifelong Learning & Literacy initiative is aimed at providing resources, technologies and programs that build literacy for Jefferson County residents of all ages, enabling our community to thrive at every stage of life.



POWERING JEFFCO TO DIGITAL LITERACY

We empowered Jefferson County residents with digital literacy through our PowerOn Jeffco program. In partnership with Jeffco Public Schools and The Action Center, we provided six weeks of basic digital literacy classes, along with free laptops and a year of internet access, to over 400 qualified community members. In October, this program earned JCPL recognition as one of Colorado's 2024 Organization Digital Inclusion Champions. This designation is awarded to organizations that have impacted their communities through their dedication to digital equity work. With 90% of participants reporting increased confidence and knowledge in using digital resources, we're proud to have made a meaningful, lasting impact on our community.

ALL ABOARD FOR EARLY LITERACY

In September, we chugged our way to the Colorado Railroad Museum for our annual Raise A Reader Festival, packed with train rides, Story Times, dance parties and more. We shared fun ways for kids to get ready to read and provided resources to help families build early literacy skills to 1,693 event attendees. According to participating parents, 88% learned something new to share with their children, 87% became more aware of library resources and services, 83% planned to spend more time interacting with their kids and 82% felt more confident in helping their children learn. It was a day full of fun, impact and learning, all rolled into one!





IMAGINE THE POSSIBILITIES

As the legendary Dolly Parton wisely said, "You can never get enough books into the hands of children." Inspired by her vision to help more children Dream More, Learn More, Care More, Be More™, JCPL committed to funding Imagination Library Colorado with \$10,000 annually from 2024 to 2028. Made possible by the Metropolitan Football Stadium District funds awarded by the County Commissioners, the 2024 contribution provided 9,090 books to Jefferson County kids, sparking imaginations and fostering a love of reading for years to come.



UNLEASHING CREATIVITY

At JCPL, we strive to ALWAYS BE creating! In March, we opened the Belmar Create Space, a dynamic makerspace where community members can bring their creative visions to life. With equipment for laser cutting, 3D printing, audio recording and more, the technology you need to fuel your innovation is more accessible than ever — the possibilities are endless!

To celebrate, we hosted 11 open lab events as part of our Creative Technology Maker series. Held at both the Columbine Library Open Space Lab and the Belmar Library Create Space, these hands-on events gave both families and adult learners the chance to explore the equipment, expand their knowledge and dive into creative technology.



DIGITAL ACCESS FOR ALL

We believe information and technology should be accessible to everyone. To provide inclusive software and tools for patrons, JCPL rolled out Assistive Technology and Digitization Workstations to four additional locations. These stations offer an array of digital editing resources and assistive technologies, such as ZoomText screen magnification, Dragon speech recognition, dyslexic reading help and more, all designed to empower users in their digital ventures.





JEFFCO READS

In June, we partnered with Jeffco Public Schools on their free summer literacy program, Jeffco READS (formerly JSELs). Our team served over 800 rising kindergarteners, first- and secondgraders, newcomer students and Extended School Year children. JCPL librarians visited nine schools twice. reading stories, sharing library resources and distributing Summer Challenge prizes. Volunteers served as "book wranglers" to help students select their prize books - always a big decision! Jeffco READs also reached newly arrived immigrants participating in adult literacy classes at select schools, providing dozens of library cards and connecting them to library resources in Spanish.

REACH MORE PEOPLE

Through our Excellence in Customer Service and Building Inclusive Community initiatives, we're transforming the way we serve and connect with our community, working to create a radically welcoming environment where all members of our community feel valued and empowered.



MORE THAN ONE MILLION

In 2024, we achieved over one million checkouts on OverDrive/Libby. From e-books and audiobooks to e-magazines, this achievement showcases how much our community loves to read. With every digital page turned, we're proud to be fueling reading habits, anytime, anywhere.



JEFFCO LOVE

We love to involve and engage our community! From the festive fun of our annual Gingerbread House Contest and Halloween Parade to special months honoring diverse groups, such as Hispanic Heritage Month and Black History Month, our libraries have remained welcoming spaces where everyone can connect, celebrate and feel at home!



EXPANDING ACCESS

To better serve the community, the Express Library West Arvada expanded its hours and is now open 5 a.m. – 10 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and 5 a.m. – 6 p.m. on Sundays. This extension made a big impact, driving a 31% increase in visits and a 12% increase in checkouts, making it easier for everyone to access the resources they need, whenever they need them.







FREE SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR STUDENTS

Each year, the Action Center helps nearly 5,000 children in Jefferson County start the school year right by providing students in need with a bag of new school supplies and a new backpack. The three-day distribution event was held in August at Everitt Middle School. JCPL took part in the fun-filled event, issuing 600 new library cards and sharing information about our resources and robust services with students and families.




LIBRARY CARDS FOR EVERYONE

In December, we launched the JCPL Digital Library Card, enhancing accessibility with a streamlined, user-friendly application. The platform removes barriers and improves the user experience by verifying user information in real time, authenticating identity, checking existing accounts and assigning the appropriate card type. This initiative has significantly expanded library access and fostered inclusivity for community members. As a result, we have issued 2,624 Digital Library Cards, increasing connectivity across our community.

CELEBRATING PRIDE. THE JCPL WAY

June was a time to promote inclusivity and acceptance by celebrating LGBTQIA+ history, culture and identity. The Library, as a pillar of the community and champions of inclusion, curated programs to encourage learning, discovery and connection for all! We ran Pride activities at all locations, tailored to different age groups. These programs allowed families to introduce themes of identity and self-celebration through age-appropriate activities for kids, safe spaces for teens to share and discover and opportunities for adults to create community through the common language of music.





MAKING DIGITAL ASSETS ACCESSIBLE **BY ALL**

Last year, Colorado took the lead as the first state in the U.S. to legally mandate website and digital service accessibility for state and local governments. As part of JCPL's ongoing efforts to meet our community where they are and our vision to be an essential destination for all. we are committed to making library digital resources as accessible as possible, from our buildings and programs to our digital services.

In spring, celebrated author Jacqueline Woodson captivated audiences with her inspiring journey from imaginative childhood beginnings to literary stardom. Hosted at Jefferson Jr./Sr. High School, the event featured an interactive Q&A led by local students, giving the community a unique opportunity to personally connect with Woodson's story.



SUMMER READING: WHERE ADVENTURE BEGINS!

In summer, we dove into a world of adventure, imagination, discovery and exploration. More than 26,000 patrons of all ages joined us for a season filled with captivating books, exciting events and fun activities. The teen writing contest, a top favorite, received 49 entries from youth around the county, with stories ranging from the fairy realm to the Wild West to a colony of rabbits living in the woods.



GROW SUSTAINABLY

Through our Embracing Innovation & Change and Continuous Process Improvement initiatives, we focus on responsible resource management, operation optimization and maximizing value to deliver sustainable services for our community today and for generations to come.

GREENER TRANSPORTATION SOLUTIONS AT JCPL

We end 2024 with more sustainable patron services than ever before! Through grant funding and reimbursement, we have been able to successfully open Electronic Vehicle Charging Ports at Belmar and Evergreen Libraries, with more to be unveiled in 2025.

STREAMLINING RECORDS REQUESTS

To improve accessibility, ease of use and alignment with the Jefferson County records request process, we've updated our Colorado Open Records Request web page and rolled out an online request form that can be submitted electronically. The updated web page reflects current information and fees, along with a link to the digital form. We're pleased to offer this streamlined process to our community!

NEW DOCUMENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

To standardize how JCPL stores and manages organizational documents, we rolled out a centralized internal document management system in 2024. This important asset streamlines information storage and access and contributes to continuity of operations.



TOMORROW'S PLANNING STARTS TODAY

Our work is informed by feedback from our community members. Last year, we connected with the public and key stakeholders to understand community needs, priorities and trends as we embark on developing a 2026+ Strategic Plan for the next phase of the library. We look forward to refreshing our vision, mission and goals to better serve Jeffco. The strategic planning process will continue until the end of 2025.





TURNING PAGES, WALKING PATHS

In November, the Standley Lake Library became home to a brand-new trailhead. Featuring a central gathering area, shade shelter, covered seating, and xeric and native plants, the Standley Lake Library Trailhead is the first in Arvada to directly connect to the Rocky Mountain Greenway.

Whether you're seeking inspiration, connection or a place to unwind, we strive to make every visit an experience that truly matters.





This year recorded a significant growth in Summer Challenge volunteer participation, with 282 teens logging 4,382 service hours in June and July — a 59% increase in number of teen volunteers and 51% increase in service hours from last year. Additionally, JCPL piloted a new drop-in teen volunteer program, which removed many traditional barriers from youth volunteerism. A total of 137 teens participated in drop-in volunteer programs.






CONVENIENT CONNECTIONS

JCPL is reaching more people through innovative programs that allow Jefferson County residents to check out and take home Wi-Fi hotspots and Wi-Fi enabled Chromebooks! Hotspots can be checked out for seven days, and Chromebooks can be checked out for 60 days. The Chromebooks are provided in partnership with Jeffco's Business and Workforce Center. JCPL also has laptops that can be reserved and used in the Arvada, Belmar, Columbine, Golden, Edgewater, Evergreen and Lakewood libraries.



LIBRARIANS AT YOUR SERVICE

Our Book a Librarian service allows patrons to schedule a one-on-one appointment with a librarian for up to one hour of uninterrupted, personalized help with a variety of needs, including business or nonprofit support, computer and mobile device assistance, e-books and e-readers, job searches, research and more. In 2024, our team completed more than 2,100 Book a Librarian appointments.



Total number of materials (both physical, digital, borrowed or used) and database use at Jefferson County Public Library.




ACTIVE HOUSEHOLDS

An index ranging from -100 to 100 that measures the likelihood that a Jefferson County Public Library cardholder will recommend our libraries to others based on a single question.



EMPLOYEES VOTE FOR A UNION

In March 2024, JCPL employees included in the collective bargaining unit chose the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) as their exclusive representative. JCPL and AFSCME are in the process of negotiating our first Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA).
