




### TEEN SURVEY SERVICES FROM Q1 RANKED - TOP 5







I've seen many libraries with staffed teen areas and this should be the norm for JCPL. Staffing teen areas support teens and serve them just as we serve other populations. Having a trusted adult other than a parent helps reduce suicide rates among teens.

Partnership with Open Space and bikes to check out or tools to repair bikes and things like that. Fishing and hiking equipment to check out.

An official Library of Things! At CALCON last year, I learned a lot about Library of Things and how many other libraries are making this available to their patrons. JCPL is behind on this and it's time to catch up. Especially because we're already lending out 'things' like hotspots, state parks passes, etc.

Ensure there is a dedicated space for our neurodiverse population, including our patrons on the autistic spectrum. Please provide adequate staff space, both for storage and for staff themselves. Belmar's break room having only 2 tables and 4 chairs is an indication that staff are not highly valued. Yes, space should be prioritized for patron use, but by providing solid work spaces for staff, you are establishing first-class service for patrons.

Also, there needs to be a dedicated Teen Area with a staffed teen desk. This is becoming the norm at libraries throughout Colorado and the US. Teens are at the forefront of many battles and they need support. They deserve their own space in libraries to be safe, supported, and to engage with their communities. The younger generations are voting more than older generations, and we will need their support.

The best thing for the new library is for the project team to really defer to frontline staff opinions on pain points in their existing libraries. What isn't working at our current branches? Let's try to avoid some of these pitfalls in a new

Please create a dedicated space for our "school age" patrons. We have spaces for adults, teens, and babies/toddlers/preschoolers, but not our K-5th grade patrons. This should be a space where they can hang out, read in comfort, play games, etc.

Listen to staff

Enough patron computers. Teen area that is away from adult areas. Homelessness isn't a huge problem, however, please realize that could change. Don't have a space that's conducive to gather and take over so others aren't

Adequate staff storage, a relaxing break room with light. Sight lines to other desks. HVAC that works. Comfortable, cleanable furniture. Normal doors that can be easily replaced if needed. A separate utility sink. A refrigerator for programming. Programming storage.

Keep in mind that not all patrons have, use or even want new technology. Our patrons love music CDs and prefer not to stream. We do many Prospector loans to obtain these items. They are not able to find the resources they are looking for on Freegal and similar resources.

An enclosed programming space in the kids room would alleviate issues with booking the meeting room for the robust children's programming schedule, including story times.



Feedback from 8 Warren Tech South students



# What should this library feel like when you're inside?

- Open and easy to navigate; Welcoming; Safe; Calming; Bright; Intellectually stimulating with a sense of academia; Comfortable
- I really like the opening, you could do a lot; You walk in and you're like, "What's behind that?"
- Textures and variations, fantasy
- Stands for new releases, picks of the month
- Area to display/showcase student/community work and projects, literature, see it in a public space

# What makes you feel like you belong?

- Natural light and varying spaces; Most schools are homogenous and set up the same; catering to various needs
- NOT Soviet or Brutalist

# How much of the library should be quiet space?

- Meeting rooms are nice for quiet; A group space means some level of talking is necessary; Variations of sizes would be helpful and a lot of meeting rooms are the same size.
- Reverse of what is the norm (split opinion on whether the norm is open spaces for less-quiet or open spaces for more quiet).
- A library is a public space, but a smaller space gives you the option {for different needs}
- What would a breakdown be? 30% quiet; 60% louder/conversation level, 40% quiet; 40% louder/conversation level, 60% quiet

## If the library had outdoor spaces, how might you or others use them?

- Collaborative spaces are important; Things you can do during a break; Inspired by books themselves, people aren't just reading them...they want to see themselves *in* them via their environment.
- We are the kind that go outside when we're reading

#### When you're outside, what do you need?

- A little of surfaces and connectivity that allows us to take notes, read textbooks, or use computers
- Glare/lighting is important need some shade options
- Gardens are conducive to group work, fresh air is nice; Have at least one fountain (water feature)
- Different background sounds and noise levels for different outside spaces

# **Features**

## Should this library try to be more unique, or try to be similar to others?

- It would be good to have different things, like a maker's space; You don't have to go far
- This building is so unique that the design benefits from its uniqueness
- If you were to close off the loading dock and open an indoor/outdoor space
- Dual use of indoor and outdoor connected spaces
- Areas that you can record and podcast equipment; My friends joke about it but it would be so cool to have a space
- Whiteboards (add a good level of uniqueness because most other spaces don't have those)
- Music options for work spaces (to allow pleasant ambient noise)

### What types of furniture are you imagining?

- Egg-shaped chairs/pods and spots for tables...a lot of other libraries don't have that sit/work combo
- Not such a divide between spaces, you get books AND work spaces
- Standing desks and variety of seating

- Avoid desk/work spaces in the middle of everything fishbowl effect
- Multiple styles of chairs and couches; benches or other things
- Flexible seating allows me to focus better
- Stable chairs or those that move (sometimes that movement makes focus challenging)

### Do these furniture and unique features give you ownership of a space?

• Yes, {the things we've talked about} that would be nice.

## Do you mainly view libraries as places to do things or go get things?

- I go get things done. I check a book out, but read it and then leave it there.
- I use it to study and focus.
- Sometimes, when libraries have activities, I go for that.
- The activities at Columbine are great and my mom takes my younger siblings a lot. They go a lot in the summer.
- I see it as a place that after going in to pick up things or check out a book, it helps me to relax.

# Should books, including large series like Manga, be in the teen space?

- Not far away, but not in it
- They should be in connected spaces

# What are the most important things you look for that make a building feel safe and accessible?

- Style and availability {to get inside}
- If people (staff) are nice, people are working there and at desks where you can ask for help
- Sometimes there is understaffing so it's hard {to find people to help you}
- Aesthetically "natural architecture" where you can see wood, and different kinds of light

## Preferences on the type of lighting (cool vs warm)?

- Warm light brings you in and cool light is helpful {for tasks}
- Warm light is calming

# **Flexibility**

## What would motivate you to regularly visit the new South County Library?

- Knowing I have a place to study {guaranteed}
- You come in and there are activities to do.
- Enough space for study rooms and you know there's one open when you come in.
- Walk in and reserve/hold a space while you look for books, etc
- Something that gets me in the door (for example: bringing my nephews for gingerbread making) and then I find something to do
- Something cool and new and ONLY at the library; glass rooms that are noise canceling
- Podcast rooms and places to record music if you played an instrument
- Voice over and camera equipment
- Old check out library slips ... bring them back to make it unique!
- I love {devices that let you check out books} being able to stack them on the area and it reads all the titles (Denver Public Library has these)

# How much do you use a library?

- Summer reading programs
- Study needs; Spaces to study with or without others
- Mix of people who go by themselves or with others
- I use the public library more than the school library.
- I only use the school library to sit in "my offs."
- I go about the same amount as my peers (2-3 times a year)

### Any non-library space for this library?

Conference rooms and meeting spaces (10 - 30) for people giving presentations

- Community space and where you can do things
- Outside spaces {that aren't just reading and studying}
- When we go to Columbine, we read and my siblings use the nearby playground. {so the same at South County would be nice}
- Rec center style with pickleball or things like that
- Pickleball and sports spaces

# Preferences on technology or the library should provide "old school" tactile way of reading?

- I like online books because they are there {easy access}, but the satisfaction of holding a book and knowing where I am in the book (is so great).
- I love a book, the smell, the feel; Having a book itself is separate from anything else.
- Not having to read on a screen helps me (my eyes)
- Reading off a screen makes me nauseous and it's such a sense of completion to close a book when you're done.

# Thinking of ALL users...

- All demographics should be able to get in the space
- My little siblings love, love the library...my little brother loves to read but also both love to do the activities at the library (and my mom takes them)

# What creates the excitement you described as a child coming into a library? Who else do we need to keep in mind?

- Staff and little kids and older people
- Just being there was cool, you felt grown up going to the library, getting to go there and pick out my own book...independence it gives you; you're reading next to a (teenager) person reading The Crucible
- The scale, the openness and grandiosity

# What is one thing that a library designed today should do for future uses?

- Outdoor design and moving us back to real, in-person experiences; It used to be that you went to work and then you went to be with your family...now technology
- I was at a meeting when I needed a whiteboard and we were so excited {flexibility and accessibility to resources like this are more and more important}
- If it has "hidden gems"...a smartboard but where you can open it and find it—discovery
- Sensory experiences benefit libraries in the long run
- Having access to a library where it's a calming space to AVOID technology.
   We're going to need this more and more.
- Longer hours that support after-school work; 8pm close or later on the weekend.

# What was one thing you learned or an idea you had today? (individual responses)

"Something I learned was how hard it is to transform a building into something new."

"I really liked the whole aspect of changing this. How much of a maze it is."

"I know we talked about it...but the whole warehouse would be so cool for a loft space."

"One thing I learned is how much design and planning it takes to reconfigure (a space)."

"I liked the idea of the outdoor playground area."

"I learned how important the outside (of the building) is."

"Just seeing the current layout and comparing it to what it can look like."

"This is a crazy idea ... I went to this place in Ashville, NC and there was a place in a mall. It was a bookstore and had cocktails. This could stir up a lot of business."

# TOUR OBSERVATIONS

- Student said it's important that the space be easy to navigate from the lobby
- Nooks and private spaces are highly valuable to teens

- Student said she liked the open flow, similar to Belmar
- Students were fairly impressed with the expansive nature of the docks and large areas that were formerly used for distribution
- Students liked that there could be accessibility added between the library and the neighborhood to the south of the property

- Open it up to different clubs that use technology (podcasting, etc); VR and gaming; professional tools that help you with presentations, etc.
- Rooms that can be reserved for meetings and businesses

- Security
- Cleanliness
- Being able to see other people (no blind corners); wayfinding and search tools and things that are autonomous if you don't want to talk to people
- Ceiling height and acoustics
