


LIBRARY SERVICES FOR A PASSIONATE COMMUNITY



CONIFER LIBRARY'S **NEW HOME**

In July 2024, the Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL) Board of Trustees approved a 10-year lease on a new, stand-alone location at 27122 Main Street in Conifer. This space was selected because it fit the needs of the community. With easy access to parking on one level, in a busy, well-trafficked area this new space is convenient and accessible.

Provide services that are accessible to all patrons.




Flexibility in collaboration, that provides acoustical separation.



A place to gather and attend programs with increased hours of service.




Elevated focus on comfort and wellness for the staff and patrons.

These spaces in the new Conifer Library become even more special with a legacy gift.

Children's Area \$5,000 DONATED BY LAURA COFFEY

A Children's Area provides space for interactive play and individual book exploration. A gift here helps us create a fun and friendly environment by furnishing this space with flexible furniture and interactive play spaces. Five-year gift recognition.

Teen Area \$3,000 DONATED BY JUDY ATWATER

Whether it's for gathering or for studying, a dedicated teen area communicates, "you belong." A designated teen area gives teens access to age-appropriate resources and collaborative technology. Five-year gift recognition.

Conifer Community Art Walls \$3,000

Our Art Walls will be curated with art that engages and inspires our next generation of creative thinkers and problem solvers. Five-year gift recognition.

Community Meeting DONATED BY Room \$10,000

A flexible community meeting room area can be closed off to create two smaller meeting rooms as needed. Upgraded technology will accommodate virtual meetings and make this a great place to bring the community together. Ten-year gift recognition.













A PLACE FOR THE **COMMUNITY TO COME TOGETHER**

In community input sessions, residents told us they want welcoming spaces where community members can connect and engage, which will become a reality in the new location!

Technology Access \$5,000 DONATED BY CORE COOPERATIVE

A designated area with access to public computers for both kids and adults. Appropriate software, technology and tools to support printing, copying, scanning and faxing. This Library of the future breaks down barriers of access and provides the digital tools your community needs. Five-year gift recognition.

Study Room \$3,000 DONATED BY CONIFER AREA COUNCIL

Private study area for small study groups, small meetings or conversation spaces. Five-year gift recognition.

Reading Alcove \$3,000 DONATED BY ALISON THAYER

This cozy nook includes comfy chairs that encourage patrons to curl up with a good book, as well as a study table near the Teen Area. Five-year gift recognition.

Self-Check Kiosk \$1,000

The self-service kiosk enables efficient checkout of materials. Five-year gift recognition.

Laptop Checkout Cart \$1,000

The laptop checkout cart provides the community with easy access to JCPL laptops that are available for patron use within the Library. Five-year gift recognition.

EMBRACING THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXTEND HOURS \$100,000

We know the Conifer community wanted access to more public hours. This new space will do just that – provide daytime hours previously only available in the summer. However, with the help of the community, we can take it a step further.

JCPL was the first library in the country to offer a cardaccessed, free-standing, self-service library at its West Arvada Express location. The introduction of this technology has been successful and the patrons in Arvada love the expanded library access it provides.

With the Conifer Library, the addition of this technology could expand the hours for patrons to access resources. Our scope of work does not cover the inclusion of this technology today. With the generosity of a community partner, we can take our already expanded hours and give the community more convenient hours to access the library.

The space we've selected has ample, well-lit parking, steady traffic and easy accessibility – it's the perfect place for extended, after-hours access. Ten-year gift recognition.
